AUSTRALIA

CROATIA

GHANA, AFRICA

Alfred Adjaottor ('07) praises the Lord for a good Vacation Bible School at New Testament Baptist Church—16 children accepted the Lord as their Savior! In October Triumph Baptist Fellowship showed Pilgrim's Progress; several were saved at the end of the film and many are now attending church regularly as a result of this outreach. At Easter TBF showed a film about the crucifixion and 50 people responded for salvation. Praise the Lord that TBF has been able to purchase land for a church building and now has a preacher to lead this growing flock. In April Alfred had the opportunity to teach a two-week block class at West Africa Baptist College in Wa. At Ghana Theological Institute, Alfred had the privilege of teaching 13 students—three have now graduated. Pray for wisdom and strength for Alfred as he seeks to fulfill a variety of ministry opportunities.

John Aidoo ('12 T) was ordained into the gospel ministry in December of 2015. Continue to remember John as he seeks to minister the Word of God in his home country.

Seth Mohenu ('90) had the privilege of baptizing 10 people last fall and seeing them added to the church membership. Through the ministry of Fundamental Baptist Mission in the Ivory Coast, Seth reports that 55 children were saved at a camp meeting and 100 were saved at a crusade held in September. Through a three-day revival, Solid Rock Baptist Mission in Ghana saw six souls saved, 40 lives rededicated to the Lord, and two men called to preach. Africa Baptist Bible Mission in Kenya held a conference for the deaf at which 65 people attended and six salvation decisions were made. Praise the Lord for working in hearts all over the continent of Africa!

Timothy Seidu ('01 T) rejoices in the continued ministries of radio, outreach churches, a Christian school (with 800 enrolled) and a seminary. Their church continues to grow through weekly salvation decisions. Please pray for the young ladies in their church and outreach fellowships—they are oftentimes pressured to marry unsaved men.

GRENADA

HAITI

Dieupie Cherubin ('00) was installed as a senator in January of this year, and he has started his six-year term. A busload of visitors drove 100 miles to see and hear a Sunday morning message from "the Senator" at Hosanna Baptist Church. Pray for Dieupie as he seeks to continue active in the ministry while serving in this public office.

Maxime Pierre-Pierre ('92 T) has had the privilege of leading a two-week Summer Bible Institute for lay leaders for over 10 years. This institute exists to help lay leaders who cannot afford a formal Bible education receive practical Bible teaching. In turn, they return to their churches and help their pastors carry the load of the ministry. Praise the Lord that Maxime's church congregation was able to send a \$2,000 gift to a church in Niger, Africa, which was burned in the wake of anti-Christian attacks. At Christmas his church distributed kits to 90 families in a camp for Haitian families displaced from the Dominican

Republic. Maxime continues to lead the Haiti Baptist Seminary of Theology, which has an enrollment of 40 students. Praise the Lord for the variety of opportunities in which He is using Maxime!

Daniel saw souls saved and baptized as a result of their Bible Conference last summer and their five-day Vacation Bible School in the fall.
